MASON CHIANG, PHARMD, RPH

Associate Director | Bristol Myers Squibb Foundation

Mason Chiang (he/him) is Associate Director at the Bristol Myers Squibb Foundation, where he leads strategic initiatives and global grantmaking to advance health equity. Director and Lipman Chair in Oncology | VCU Massey Comprehensive Cancer Center Professor of pulmonary disease and critical care medicine | VCU School of Medicine

As director of VCU Massey Comprehensive Cancer Center, Dr. Winn leads an NCI-designated center advancing cancer care, research, and community partnerships to improve equity. He is nationally recognized for models that engage communities in reducing cancer disparities.

Dr. Winn serves as President of the Association of American Cancer Institutes and Chair of the National Cancer Policy Forum. His many honors include the NCI CURE Program Lifetime Achievement Award and the 2024 ASCO Allen Lichter Visionary Leader Award. In 2022, the Bristol Myers Squibb Foundation renamed its clinical trials program after him to honor his work advancing participation in research.



LUCIO MIELE, MD, PHD

Cancer Crusaders Professor of Genetics; Director, LSU-LCMC Cancer Center

Dr. Lucio Miele is a physician-scientist and cancer biologist who serves as the Cancer Crusaders Professor of Genetics and Director of the LSU-LCMC Cancer Center. He is internationally recognized for research in breast cancer biology, health disparities, and precision medicine. Dr. Miele earned his MD and PhD from the University of Naples and completed a fellowship at the NIH. He previously held leadership roles at the FDA, Loyola University Chicago, the University of Mississippi, and the University of Illinois at Chicago.

At LSU, he leads the Precision Medicine Program, is PI for the "All of Us" Research Program, and co-leads NIH-funded initiatives on cancer disparities and informatics. A national leader in Notch signaling research, he has authored over 280 publications. Dr. Miele also holds editorial and review roles with major journals and funding agencies and contributes to national efforts advancing equity in cancer research.

DAVID HORNE, MD, MPH

Professor of Medicine, University of Washington

Dr. Horne is a Professor of Medicine in the Division of Pulmonary, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine and an Adjunct Professor of Global Health at the University of Washington. His research focuses on tuberculosis, including aerobiology, pathogenesis, and drivers of disease in high-burden settings, with primary collaborations in Kenya. Clinically, he cares for patients in the ICU and in a pulmonary clinic specializing in nontuberculous mycobacterial infections. Since 2022, he has served as Associate Chair of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion for the Department of Medicine.



RACHEL BENDER IGNACIO, MD, MPH

Associate Professor of Medicine, University of Washington

Dr. Bender Ignacio is Director of UW Positive Research, Associate Professor in the Division of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, and Robert W. Anderson Endowed Chair in Medicine for HIV Research at the University of Washington. She earned her MD and MPH from UW and completed internal medicine training at Massachusetts General Hospital before returning for her infectious diseases fellowship.

Her work focuses on clinical trials for HIV treatment, coinfections, and cancers, as well as improving care delivery in Southern and East Africa. She also led outpatient COVID-19 therapeutics research as Director of the Fred Hutch COVID-19 Clinical Research Center. Clinically, she provides HIV primary care and consults on Infectious Diseases and Transplant ID services. Dr. Bender Ignacio is dedicated to mentoring early career investigators and serves as Chair of Advocacy for HIVMA and IDSA.

THERESA LAGUNA, MD, MSC

Pediatric Pulmonologist; Division Head of Pulmonary and Sleep Medicine at Seattle Children's Hospital; Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Washington School of Medicine

Dr. Laguna has made mentorship and sponsorship her life's work. She has a more than 17-year track-record of exceptional career mentoring at the undergraduate, medical student, resident, fellowship, and junior faculty level at every institution in which she has served. She is active in diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) initiatives locally, regionally, and nationally and strongly believes that "if you see it, you can be it." As a Latinx woman and member of the LGBTQIA+ community in a leadership role in academic medicine, she strives to bring her authentic self to work every day and use her voice and leadership platforms to advance DEI initiatives for patients, trainees, and colleagues.



YAW NYAME, MD, MS, MBA

Physician and Associate Professor, Division of Urology, University of Washington School of Medicine

Dr. Nyame is a surgeon, researcher, and educator specializing in urologic oncology and general urology. His clinical focus includes open and minimally invasive surgeries for kidney, prostate, bladder, and testicular cancers.

He earned his MD and MBA from Northwestern University and a master's in health services administration from George Washington University. Dr. Nyame completed residency at the Cleveland Clinic and a urologic oncology fellowship at the University of Washington, where he is now on faculty. His research explores healthcare disparities and the molecular and health services drivers of inequities in urologic cancers.

Professor of Medicine in the Division of Cardiology, University of Washington School of Medicine

Eugene Yang, MD, MS, FACC is a Professor of Medicine in the Division of Cardiology at the University of Washington School of Medicine, where he holds the Carl and Renée Behnke Endowed Chair for Asian Health. He earned both his undergraduate and graduate degrees from Stanford University, followed by his medical degree from the University of Pennsylvania. He completed his residency in internal medicine and fellowships in cardiovascular disease and advanced cardiac imaging at Stanford.



JASON "JAY" MENDOZA, MD, MPH

Professor of Public Health Sciences, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center

Dr. Mendoza is a general pediatrician and researcher specializing in cancer prevention and health equity. He is Professor of Public Health Sciences and Associate Program Head of Cancer Prevention at Fred Hutch and Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Washington. As Associate Director of Community Outreach and Engagement for the Fred Hutch/UW/Seattle Children's Cancer Consortium, he leads efforts to reduce cancer disparities.

His NIH-funded research focuses on community-engaged interventions to improve nutrition and physical activity among underserved youth and to lower cardiometabolic disease risk in adolescent and young adult cancer survivors through technologybased programs. Dr. Mendoza earned his MD from Rush Medical College, completed pediatrics residency at UW/Seattle Children's, and received advanced research training and an MPH through the UW Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholars Program.

KRISTINE KARVONEN, MD

Assistant Professor, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center

Dr. Karvonen is a pediatric hematologist-oncologist who studies social determinants of health and disparities affecting children and adolescents with cancer and blood disorders. Her research examines barriers such as structural racism, poverty, and limited health literacy, and focuses on developing interventions to advance health equity. Clinically, she cares for patients with cancer and sickle cell anemia at Seattle Children's Cancer and Blood Disorders Center.



MATTHEW HALLMAN, MD, MS

Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology and Pain Medicine, University of Washington

Dr. Mathew Hallman is a board-certified critical care physician at Harborview Medical Center and a UW assistant professor. He is dedicated to delivering high-quality, evidence-based care to critically ill and injured patients and believes involving patients and families in treatment decisions is essential to excellent care.

Dr. Hallman earned his MS from Georgetown University and his MD from the University of Minnesota. His clinical and research interests include medical education, traumatic brain and spinal cord injury, neurological critical care, trauma care, and the use of ultrasound in perioperative and intensive care settings.



CINDY TIAN, MD, PHD

Chief Resident, Department of Emergency Medicine, University of Washington

Dr. Tian is Chief Resident in the University of Washington Emergency Medicine Residency Program. She grew up in the Seattle area, earned her undergraduate degree from Brown University, and completed her MD/PhD at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. Her career interests include critical care, research, and diversity, equity, and inclusion in emergency medicine.

CHRISTOPHER LI, PHD

Epidemiologist, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center

Dr. Christopher Li is an epidemiologist focused on identifying breast cancer risk factors. He has uncovered key links between breast cancer and lifestyle factors like obesity, physical activity, alcohol use, and certain medications. Dr. Li also studies disparities in cancer outcomes and works to ensure research benefits patients of all backgrounds.

He leads research on breast cancer risk in young women and headed the largest study on triple-negative breast cancer, an aggressive subtype. Combining lab work with big data, he identifies patterns that predict recurrence and blood-based biomarkers for early detection. Dr. Li co-leads Fred Hutch's Cancer Surveillance System, a registry tracking cancer incidence and survival in 13 Washington counties, widely used to study cancer trends and outcomes.



JOHNNIE J. OROZCO, MD, PHD

Associate Professor, Translational Science & Therapeutics Division | Fred Hutch Cancer Center Associate Professor, Division of Hematology & Oncology, Department of Medicine | University of Washington (UW)

Dr. Orozco develops targeted therapies for blood cancers, with a focus on acute myeloid leukemia. His team uses radioimmunotherapy—radiation linked to antibodies—to reduce the need for toxic chemotherapy and total body irradiation in stem cell transplant models.

A Latino physician-scientist, he works to expand access through haploidentical transplantation for patients lacking matched donors and translates promising findings into clinical trials. He also mentors students from underrepresented backgrounds and advocates for faculty diversity. Dr. Orozco completed his MD/PhD at UW, trained at UCSF, and holds a BS in Chemical Engineering from UCLA.

DEBBIE ANDERSON

Debbie found care for Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia at Seattle Cancer Care Alliance (now a part of Fred Hutch) when she was diagnosed in 2017. Given the treatment choices at that time she opted for a clinical trial. Debbie is retired from social services and a transplant from the east coast. While she lived in South Florida most of her life, she came to Bellingham, WA to be near her daughter's family from Maryland where she lived for 15 years.
